## CONSTITUTION REFORM DIASPORA CONSULTATIONS

The Government of Grenada has embarked on another phase in the consultative process of constitution reform which was launched on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of December 2010. This process continues the work done by two prior Constitution Review Commissions which reported in 1985 and 2006 and provides the foundation for the draft constitution which is now the subject of these series of consultations.

The Attorney General's Chambers is the department of government responsible for piloting the process. This is to underscore the fact that this is a non-partisan, all-inclusive process given that the Attorney General is a public officer and not a politician.

Consultations have already been held with several stakeholders in Grenada including: the Grenada Chamber of Industry and Commerce, Grenada Conference of Churches, Inter Agency Grouping of Development Organizations, Media Workers Association, among others.

For the first time in the history of Grenada the consultative process of constitution reform is being taken to the Diaspora. A team from the Attorney General's Chambers comprising Professor Simeon McIntosh, professor of jurisprudence at the University of the West Indies Cave Hill Campus and Mr. Robert Branch Senior legal Counsel in the Ministry of legal Affairs will travel to Canada and the United States to consult with the Grenadian community in Orlando, Miami/Ft. Lauderdale, Montreal, Toronto, New York, Washington, DC, Maryland and Atlanta from June 18<sup>th</sup> to July 8<sup>th</sup> 2011.

The document that emerges at the end of this process of consultation would be brought back to the Grenadian people for further consultation before going to a vote in a public referendum.
